In Chapter ii. we saw that many of the valuable and carefully reasoned results which Weismann had obtained are accompanied by much detailed speculation based upon an extremely limited fact basis. In his later writings especially, the reader who searches for the facts and reasoning which refer to such questions as the non-transmission of acquired characters will find everywhere an abundant commingling with speculations concerning the mechanical process of heredity. I have ventured in the appendix to sketch shortly this speculation of Weismann's, and to give my own estimation of its value. Weismann was not the first to speculate or found a mechanical theory of heredity; Darwin himself published a theory of pangenesis, and this was, I believe, the only piece of speculation of which Darwin was ever guilty.
