The founder of the spiritual philosophy he dubbed anthroposophy meaning "wisdom of the human being" as well as the originator of Waldorf schools, biodynamic farming, and other influential institutions and ideas, Austrian philosopher Rudolf Steiner (1861-1925) wrote some 30 books and delivered thousands of lectures across Europe. The extracts in this volume, based on brief, pithy quotations from Steiner's collected works, present his core concepts on epidemics of thought as well as disease; rather than full discussions, they are intended to open up avenues into the complexity of Steiner's extraordinary world of ideas. 66.
